

**Minutes**  
**University Committee on Courses and Curricula**  
**16 November 2001**

Belli called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m. in Lloyd-Ricks Annex, north-end.

Bryant moved, seconded by Bridges, to approve the minutes of the September 19, 2001 meeting. The motion passed unanimously.

Herring moved, seconded by Henington, to approve the addition of ACC 4203/6203 Accounting Internship. After brief discussion the motion was passed unanimously, contingent on the addition of site supervisor evaluation information and a slight revision of the evaluation section to explicitly show graduate grade percentages.

Bridges moved, seconded by Althen, to approve the deletion of AEC 8133 Resource Economics, AEC 8213 Advanced Agricultural Price Analysis, AEC 8223 Spatial Equilibrium Analysis, AEC 8453 Advanced Theory of Demand for Agricultural Production, AEC 8353 Advanced Agricultural Production Economics, AEC 8523 Advanced Resource Economics, and AEC 8543 Agricultural Policy. The motion passed unanimously.

Bridges moved, seconded by Palmer, to approve the addition of AEC 8813 Advanced Production and Risk Analysis, AEC 8823 The International Economy, AEC 8833 Environmental and Resource Economics, and AEC 8843 Survey Design & Experimental Economics. Discussion followed regarding the possibility that the course AEC 8823 overlapped existing courses, specifically, IB 8612 and IB 8613. The motion to approve the additions passed unanimously, contingent upon Belli verifying that duplication with IB 8612 and/or IB 8613 was not an issue.

Bridges moved, seconded by Althen, to approve the addition of GNS 4133/6133 Human Genetics, and the cross-listed course BIO 4133/6133 Human Genetics. The motion passed unanimously.

Bridges moved, seconded by Henington, to approve the addition of NTR 8463 Advanced Animal Nutrition. The motion passed unanimously.

Bridges moved, seconded by Palmer, to approve the deletion of BIO 2203 Dendrology and the addition of FO 2112 Dendrology and FO 2111 Dendrology Lab. The motion passed unanimously.

Bridges moved, seconded by Henington, to approve the modification of EN 4433/6433 Teaching English as a Second Language. The motion passed unanimously.

Bridges moved, seconded by Palmer, to approve the modification of PH 3063 Introduction to Astronomy. The motion passed unanimously.

Bridges moved, seconded by Althen, to approve the modification of PH 4142/6142 Intermediate Laboratory. The motion passed unanimously.

Bridges moved, seconded by Henington, to approve the modification of CS 8843 Complexity of Sequential and Parallel Algorithms. The motion passed unanimously.

Bridges moved, seconded by Palmer, to approve the modification of FO 4231/6231 Forest Operations and Harvesting Lab and FO 4232/6232 Forest Operations and Harvesting. The motion passed unanimously.

Bridges moved, seconded by Henington, to approve the modification to FO 4452/6452 Remote Sensing Applications, FO 4451/6451 Remote Sensing Applications Laboratory, FO 4471/6471 GIS for Natural Resource Management Laboratory, and FO 4472/6472 GIS for Natural Resource Management. The motion passed unanimously.

Bridges moved, seconded by Henington, to approve the modification of FP 4223/6223 Furniture Production I and FP 4233/6233 Furniture Production II. The motion passed unanimously.

Bridges moved, seconded by Palmer, to approve the addition of WF 8012 Advanced Applied Ecology and WF 8343 Conceptual Ecology & Natural Resources Management. The motion passed unanimously.

Bridges moved, seconded by Henington, to approve the modification of the AETB Major, Land Surveying Option. Discussion followed regarding this option. It was noted that the land surveying option was not currently included in the curriculum rules maintained by the Office of the Registrar. Henington moved, seconded by Bridges, to table the motion pending further investigation as to whether the option had ever been approved by the UCCC. The motion to table passed with one (1) vote in opposition.

Henington moved, seconded by Bridges, to approve the modification of the computer literacy requirement for the B.A. degree in Anthropology. The motion passed with one (1) vote in opposition.

Bridges moved, seconded by Henington, to approve the modification to Forest Products Major, Building Supply Operations Option; Forest Products Major, Industrial Environmental Operations Option; Forest Products Major, Forest Products Marketing Option; Forest Products Major, Forest Products Technology Option; and Forest Products Major, Wood Industries Management Option. The motion passed unanimously.

Bridges moved, seconded by Palmer to approve the modification to the Wildlife Science, Fisheries Science, and Law Enforcement Options of the Wildlife and Fisheries Science Major. The motion passed unanimously.

Jennings moved, seconded by Bridges, to remove the proposals to delete CVM 5724 Bovine Nutrition and Records Analysis, CVM 5744 Food Animal Production Medicine, and to add CVM 5722 Small Ruminant Production Medicine from the table. The motion passed unanimously. An update was presented by Jennings. The original motion to approve the deletions and the addition passed unanimously.

Belli brought new business with a memo from Clyde Williams regarding Provost Cole bypassing UCCC guidelines for course modifications. Discussion following with Belli proposing a letter to Cole addressing the issue. The UCCC unanimously agreed to send the letter. (See attached letter from UCCC to Cole.)
