Belli announced that he is serving as the Associate Dean, College of Forest Resources and that he would be stepping down from Chair, UCCC at the end of the term in June 2004. He asked the members to start thinking about someone to serve as Chair and reminded the committee that the Chair is elected in January of each year.
