Chamblee called the meeting to order at 2:01 p.m. on Friday, October 24, 2008 in Coskrey Auditorium in Memorial Hall. Chamblee introduced Laura Crittenden from Academic Outreach and Continuing Education and Kevin Rogers from the College of Business. Wolverton moved, seconded by Worthy, to approve the minutes from the September 24, 2008. The motion passed unanimously.

The motion passed unanimously.

Carr moved, seconded by Thompson, to approve the AOCE offering of HI 4273 Women in American history, and HI 4363 Afro-American History and Culture. The motion passed unanimously.

The motion passed unanimously.

Wolverton moved, seconded by Moore, to approve the addition of GLC 3412 Appalachian Leadership Honors Program 1. The motion passed unanimously.

Wolverton moved, seconded by Moore, to approve the modification of PO 4513 Poultry Processing and PO 4523 Commercial Broiler Processing. The motion passed unanimously.

Wolverton moved, seconded by Moore to approve the addition of AS 2523 Military Leadership and MS 2523 Military Leadership. It was noted that neither course contained a detailed course outline. Wolverton moved, seconded by Worthy, to table both proposals. The motion to table AS 2523 Military Leadership and MS 2523 Military Leadership passed unanimously.

Wolverton moved, seconded by Thompson, to approve the addition of CO 3413 News Gathering. The motion passed unanimously.

Wolverton moved, seconded by Moore, to approve the addition of GR 4283/6283 Geography of Islamic World. The motion passed unanimously.

Wolverton moved, seconded by Moore, to approve the modification of PH 2213 Physics I. The motion passed unanimously.

Wolverton moved, seconded by Moore, to approve the modification of the Bachelor of Science in Medical Technology degree. The motion passed unanimously.

Wolverton moved, seconded by Moore, to approve the modification of the Bachelor of Science degrees in Computer Engineering and Software Engineering, and the Master of Science degree in Computer Science to a five-year combined BS/MS degree. A question was raised about the benefit of the five-year program. Bruce explained that many engineering students are interested in completing a Master's program but the cost and time required for a traditional Master's degree is a deterrent. She also stated that many engineering students make commitments to employers in their junior year before they have given thought to attending graduate school. Lengthy discussion continued on the need and requirements of the combined five-year program. The motion was approved by a vote of 10-1-3. Chamblee stated that both the BS and MS degrees would go to the Graduate Council and then the Academic Deans Council for approval.

Wolverton moved, seconded by Bruce, to adjourn at 3:20 p.m.
