Chamblee called the meeting to order at 2:05 p.m. on Wednesday, December 19, 2007, in Coskrey Auditorium in Memorial Hall. Henry moved, seconded by Wolverton, to approve the minutes from the January 19, 2007, meeting. The motion to approve the minutes passed unanimously.

Henry moved, seconded by Edwards-Henry, to approve to AOCE offering of PSS 2343 Floral Design. Wolverton asked about the cost and shipment of floral material to students. Chamblee explained that the material would be sent in four shipments, and the cost would be paid by the students in their AOCE fees. The motion passed unanimously.

Henry moved, seconded by Wolverton to approve the addition and AOCE offering of AEC 8713 Rural Community and Economic Development. Chamblee stated that the department was adding it as an official course since it had been offered several times as a special topic course for the Community College Leadership program. The motion passed unanimously.

Wolverton moved, seconded by Edwards-Henry, to approve the addition of CO 3543 Improvisation, and CO 3563 Voice and Movement. The motion passed unanimously.

Henington moved, seconded by Wolverton to approve the modification of PSY 3103, the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology degree and the Bachelor of Science in Psychology degree. The motion passed unanimously.

Wolverton moved, seconded by Edwards-Henry, to approve the modification of TKT 3153 Teaching Business Technology and the Business Technology concentration in the

Bachelor of Science in Technology Teacher Education degree. The motion passed unanimously.

Swortzel moved, seconded by Wolverton, to approve the addition of an Agricultural Economics concentration to the Master of Science degree in Agriculture and the Master of Science degree in Agribusiness Management. The motion passed unanimously.

Swortzel moved, seconded by Henington, to approve the addition of a Culinology concentration to the Bachelor of Science degree in Food Science, Nutrition, and Health Promotion. Henry asked how the tuition would be handled for the students enrolled in the program. In a phone conversation between Hudson and Wes Schilling, Schilling stated that students would pay the regular tuition rates for their institution. Nobles asked if an agreement between MSU and MUW had been approved. Chamblee indicated that MUW's Culinary Arts department and MSU's Food Science department were working on the agreement details. The motion passed contingent on receiving a signed agreement between MSU and MUW.

Wolverton moved, seconded by Henington, to approve the addition of a Technology Management concentration to the BBA in BUSI offered at the Meridian campus. The motion passed unanimously.

Henington moved, seconded by R. Rogers, to approve the AOCE offering of ECE 8453 Introduction to Wavelets. The motion passed unanimously.

Henry moved, seconded by Wolverton, to adjourn at 2:55 p.m.
